Un mensaje para padres y maestros . . .

La vida y el trabajo en el rancho pueden ser muy peligrosos. Cada año casi 300 niños/niñas son matados en los ranchos y 23,500 son lastimados. Niños/niñas quienes viven en los ranchos o pasan tiempo en los ranchos con sus padres son expuestos a varios peligros que pueden causar lastimaduras o muerte. Ésto incluye maquinaria como tractores, químicos, animales, la corriente eléctrica, y estancamientos de aguas. Porque estos peligros son parte del ambiente normal en los ranchos, no se consideran peligrosos. *Usted puede ayudar a prevenir estas lastimaduras enseñándole a los niños/niñas como reconocer y como evitar estos peligros.*

BIENVENIDOS AL RANCHO es un libro para colorear, hecho para ayudar a niños/niñas aprender sobre los peligros en el rancho. Usted puede utilizarlo a su máximo haciendo lo siguiente:

- * Practique la seguridad usted mismo. Por ejemplo: nunca permita que un niño/niña vaya en un auto/van sin el cinturón de seguridad o el asiento de bebe. Todo el tiempo sea un buen modelo al usar usted su cinturón de seguridad.
- * Repase las escenas en el libro con su niño/niña y anímelo a colorear todas las páginas. Preguntele al niño/niña que le diga qué es lo que mira en cada página.
- * Procure que sea divertido. Dele a su niño/niña un premio especial cuando termine de colorear todo el libro. Ésto puede ser algo simple como una caminata juntos o haciendole un certificado.
- * Hable sobre los mensajes de seguridad en cada dibujo. Por ejemplo: hable con su niño/niña sobre las razones porqué él o ella debe de mantenerse lejos de cualquier maquinaria para evitar problemas como es caerse de un tractor, o ser atrapado en equipo o ser atropellado.
- * Refuerze los conceptos de seguridad en el libro de colorear cuando se encuentre éste en el rancho. Busque todas las oportunidades para repasar esta información cuando esten juntos.

WELCOME TO THE FARM

A BILINGUAL PARENT/TEACHER GUIDE

A message for parents and teachers . . .

Farm work and farm life can be very dangerous. Close to 300 children are killed on farms nationwide each year, and as many as 23,500 are injured. Children who live on farms or spend time in the fields with their parents are exposed to many hazards that can cause injury or death. These include machinery (such as tractors), chemicals, animals, electrical power sources, and irrigation ponds. Because these hazards are part of normal farm life, they may not even be seen as dangerous. *You can help prevent these injuries by teaching children what to look for and how to avoid hazards.*

WELCOME TO THE FARM is a coloring book designed to help children learn about farm hazards. You can maximize its usefulness in the following ways:

- * Practice safety yourself. For example, never allow a child to ride in a car or van without a seat belt or car seat, and always set an example by wearing your seat belt.
- * Review the scenes in the book with your child, and encourage him/her to color every page. Ask him/her to tell you what they see in each picture.
- * Let this be fun. Give your child a special reward when the book is all completely colored. It can be something very simple, like taking a walk together or making a small certificate of completion.
- * Talk about the safety messages in the pictures. For example, talk with your child about why he/she should stay away from machinery. The answer is to avoid problems such as falling from a tractor, getting caught in a piece of moving machinery, or being run over.
- * Reinforce the safety concepts in the coloring book when you are on the farm. Look for chances to review them when you are together.

For Classroom Use:

BIENVENIDOS AL RANCHO / WELCOME TO THE FARM is designed to assist in teaching young children about farm hazards. The coloring book can be an engaging way for children to learn safety concepts. Its objective is for children to recognize and name hazards on the farm.

The coloring book can be used in your classroom any number of ways. You can review the safety concepts with your students and then encourage them to color. When they have completed coloring, ask questions about the hazards to reinforce the ideas. One-on-one work with children during unstructured time is another method. Display students' colored pages in your classroom and conduct follow-up activities to serve as review.

- WHY:** Because close to 300 children are killed each year on farms, and over 23,000 are injured. These injuries and deaths can be prevented!
- HOW:** By helping children and their parents identify and recognize farm hazards, we can prevent agricultural injuries among children.

PREVENTING AGRICULTURAL INJURIES AMONG CHILDREN

Farm work and farm life can be very dangerous. Close to 300 children are killed on farms nationwide each year, and over 23,000 are injured. Children who live on farms or spend time in the fields with their parents are exposed to many hazards that can cause injury or death.

The hazards in the agricultural environment include:

- * machinery (including unguarded PTO's),
- * tractors, which are extremely dangerous for children to ride,
- * chemicals such as pesticides,
- * animals,
- * electrical power sources,
- * and irrigation ponds, among others.

Because these hazards are part of normal farm life, they may not even be seen as dangerous.

Bienvenidos Al Rancho/Welcome to the Farm is designed to assist in teaching young children about farm hazards. The coloring book can be an engaging way for children to learn safety concepts. Its objective is for children to recognize and avoid hazards. The Parent/Teacher Guide offers numerous suggestions about how to maximize the coloring book's usefulness.

The coloring book can be also be used in the classroom. Teachers can review the safety concepts with students and then encourage them to color. When they have completed coloring, they can ask questions about the hazards to reinforce the ideas.







but they can be dangerous.**





¡Las sustancias químicas nunca se deben de tocar!

Bombas de agua son peligrosas por los cables eléctricos. Te puedes lastimar si juegas allí.


Water pumps are dangerous because of electricity. You can get hurt or die if you play there.




*¿Podemos jugar allí?

El proyecto NURSE---Enfermeras Usando Eventos Rurales Centinelas---se lleva a cabo por el Programa de Salud Ocupacional de California del Departamento de Salud en cooperación con el Instituto Nacional para Salud y Seguridad Ocupacional. La meta del programa es prevenir lastimaduras ocupacionales asociadas con la agricultura. Los hospitales, servicios de emergencia, clínicas y personal forense son los que reportan las lastimaduras. Se investigan casos seleccionados para lo cual se hace una entrevista del trabajador lastimado, compañeros de trabajo, patrones y todo aquel envuelto en el incidente. También se visita el lugar de los hechos para hacer una investigación sobre la seguridad. Estas investigaciones proveen información detallada sobre el trabajador, el ambiente del trabajo y los factores de riesgo potencial que resultaron en la lastimadura. Cada investigación concluye con recomendaciones específicas diseñadas para prevenir lastimaduras; y para el uso de trabajadores, patrones y todo aquel interesado en la salud y seguridad en al agricultura.
