FOOTNOTES TO ADJUSTED STATE PROFILES

1. Profiles were prepared by State agencies, primary care associations (PCAs), or by contractors working cooperatively with the migrant health centers, state agencies, and PCAs. Profiles were generally based on 1985 to 1987 data, although the methodologies for the computations varied widely among states. Some of the profile results have been accepted by the Office of Migrant Health as submitted. Others were "adjusted" by the Office of Migrant Health during the validation process to remove or add groups incorrectly included/excluded, to correct mathematical errors, or to provide for comparability among profiles in the definitions and non-working dependents multiplication factors used. The profiles do include duplication of counts within states in which migrant farmworkers move from location to location, establishing temporary abodes for purposes of seasonal agricultural work. Similarly, migrant farmworkers are counted in EACH state in which they temporarily reside.
2. Profile data followed by this footnote appear to require "adjustment", but insufficient information for development of a suitable adjustment factor was available at the time of this tabulation. The national totals at the bottom of the page would be 868,329 migrant and 1,872,262 seasonal farmworkers and members of their families (2,740,971 MSFWs) if those profiles still requiring adjustments were excluded.
