

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FARM POPULATION - MIGRATION TO AND FROM FARMS, 1920-54

Prepared in the Agricultural Marketing Service

This report gives the latest estimates of the farm population for geographic divisions and regions, of migration to and from the farm population, and of births and deaths of persons living on farms. <sup>1/</sup> Certain of the estimates are for areas and dates for which estimates have not previously been published; others are revisions of previously published estimates.

New estimates presented:

- (1) Farm population for geographic subdivisions, 1950-54.
- (2) Elements of change in the farm population for geographic subdivisions, and the United States, 1949-53.

Revised statistics presented:

- (1) Farm population for geographic subdivisions, 1920-49.
- (2) Natural increase for geographic subdivisions and the United States, 1940-48.
- (3) Civilian migration to and from farms for geographic subdivisions and the United States, 1940-48.
- (4) Migration for geographic subdivisions and the United States, 1929, 1930, 1939.

Similar estimates of the farm population for geographic divisions and regions and of the components of the change occurring each year were published in earlier reports of the former Bureau of Agricultural Economics. Those estimates are superseded and should no longer be used.

Patterns of Change in the Farm Population.--The farm population of the United States has been characterized by a high degree of mobility between farm and nonfarm areas. In almost every year since 1921 more than 2 million persons have moved to or from farms. In general, the movement away from farms each year has been greater than the movement to farms. The only exceptions since World War I were the brief periods during the depression and immediately following the end of World War II.

The amount of movement to and from farms has varied during the years for which data are available. In the 1920-30 decade there was an average from-farm movement of nearly 2 million persons per year and an average to-farm migration of 1.3 million persons. In the next decade, the average migration away was considerably less -- 1.5 million persons per year left farms while the movement to farms averaged about the same as in the previous decade--1.2 million. Between 1940 and 1950, the rate of migration away from farms was greatly stepped up over that of the 1930-40 decade while the rate of migration to farms stayed about the same -- 2.1 million per year moved away from farms and an average of 1.2 million moved to farms. After 1950 an average of 1.8 million persons left farms each year while over 600,000 moved to farms each year.

In each period the net loss through migration was offset wholly or largely by the excess of births over deaths occurring during the decade. Between 1920 and 1930, natural increase averaged 485,000 a year. During the decade of the 1930's, births exceeded deaths by about 385,000 per year and the following decade by 400,000. Since 1950, births to farm residents have averaged about 590,000 and deaths about 195,000, resulting in an average natural increase of about 395,000.

As a result of the migration and natural increase between 1920 and 1930, the total farm population changed from 32.0 million to 30.5 million. In 1940, the farm population was about the same as it was in 1930, but in 1950 it was 25.1 million, or about 5.5 million lower than the previous decade. In April 1954, the farm population was about 21,890,000.

Availability of economic (or other) opportunities in nonfarm areas and the tides of technological progress in agriculture account for the changing migration magnitudes. In the 1920-30 and 1940-50 decades, when opportunities for nonfarm employment were available, and when mechanization of farms was proceeding rapidly, net migration from farms was high. During the 1930-40 decade, on the other hand, when nonfarm employment opportunities were less and when progress in mechanization was somewhat retarded, many potential migrants remained on farms, and many who had migrated returned from nonfarm areas.

Migration from the farm population since 1950 has occurred among all age groups of both sexes. The most striking changes have occurred among those groups in which large migrations from the farm population are usual when opportunities are available in the nonfarm economy. 2/

The high rate of migration from farms has tended to result in a somewhat more favorable relationship of population to the farm resource base in some areas. In other areas, even though migration has been heavy, the relationship is still not particularly favorable. Medium birth rates among farm people, 26 per 1,000 in the South, and low death rates, about 7 per 1,000 in the West, occurred in the year April 1953 to April 1954. Population in excess of that needed on farms is continually being produced in most geographic areas.

Changes in Farm Population, 1950-54.--Marked changes occurred in farm population levels in most areas of the United States between 1950 and 1954. The population living on farms in the United States numbered about 21,890,000 in April 1954 (table 1) compared with 25,058,000 in 1950. This drop in farm population between 1950 and 1954 represents a continuation of the longtime downward trend which has reduced the number of farm residents to 13.5 percent of the total population (13.8 percent of the civilian population).

The country as a whole experienced a decrease of 12.6 percent in the total number of persons living on farms between 1950 and 1954. There were decreases in the farm population in all of the geographic divisions. Decreases ranged from 4 percent in the Pacific Division to about 21 percent in the West South Central Division (table 3).

Even though the geographic divisions experienced varying percentage losses in farm population during the 4-year period, the relative distribution of the farm population among the divisions changed only slightly during this period. In general, changes affecting one geographic division in recent years have been felt to greater or lesser extent in all the others. Birth rates have risen and declined and risen again and rates of migration from and to farms have varied in response to varying economic and other conditions within the total economy. Movement of the young men from farms to the Armed Forces increased at the time of the Korean situation. Return of discharged veterans to the farm population was noted as soon as negotiations for cessation of hostilities were begun. Regionally, the South had just about half of the farm population in 1954, the West and the Northeast each had about 9 percent, and the North Central Region had the remaining 32 percent (table 2).

1/ In the release Farm Population Estimates, January 1949, U. S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics, June 1949, net change through interdivisional farm-to-farm movement was inadvertently omitted from the change through migration. The estimates in this report have been corrected for this oversight. Estimates of interdivisional change through farm-to-farm movement were not made prior to 1930.

2/ Includes persons who have not moved but who were in or out of the farm population because agricultural operations ceased or were begun on the places where they were living. Estimates of change accounted for by the change in classification of residence from farm to nonfarm or vice versa were obtained for the years 1930-39 through comparison of farm data from the Censuses of Agriculture of 1930, 1935 and 1940. This type of change was not estimated separately for other years and is included in the estimates of movement to or from farms depending on the direction of the net difference between the changes from farm to nonfarm and nonfarm to farm residences. In using estimates of movement to or from farms for 1930-39, the change caused by change in classification of residence should be included with the estimates of movement to farms or from farms (depending on the direction of the change indicated by the sign).

Note on Method of Developing Farm Population Estimates.--The foregoing tables contain estimates derived from four principal sources. These are: (1) Current Population Surveys (interview) of the Bureau of the Census from which the Census-AMS estimates of the total farm population of the United States are derived; (2) Annual Surveys of the Farm Population (mailed questionnaire) of the Agricultural Marketing Service from which the geographic distribution and components of change in the farm population are derived; (3) decennial population censuses; and (4) other related data.

A complete technical statement on the methods used in estimating components of change in the farm population is being prepared and will be available in 1955. The statement will contain recent analyses of the adequacy of data obtained in the Annual Farm Population Survey.

Limitations of the Estimates.--The following statement can be made about the estimates in the tables included in this report. Data for geographic areas are based on mailed questionnaire survey data tied to benchmark figures from censuses and adjusted to total estimates of farm population obtained from enumerative sample surveys. The reliability of any geographic subdivision estimate is therefore dependent upon the size of the sample on which it was based and the representativeness of returns from the mailed questionnaire survey. It is also dependent on the correspondence and closeness of the sample and benchmark dates.

Estimates for the geographic divisions resulting from the mailed questionnaire survey data, particularly those for which the sample was relatively small should be used with caution. This factor is important in analyzing the components of change in the farm population and especially in appraising any changes occurring from one year to another. The reliability of year to year changes is more limited than the reliability of comparisons over a period of several years. Also, figures for areas that contain relatively large populations with marginal farm connections may be subject to greater error than those for other divisions, even for benchmark dates.

This report contains estimates comparable to estimates in this release. The cooperative releases of the former Bureau of Agricultural Economics and the Bureau of the Census in Farm Population, Series Census-BAE, now called Census-AMS (P-27), contain current estimates of the distribution of the total farm population of the country by age, sex, labor-force status, and other related material.

Farms and Farm People, a special cooperative report of the former Bureau of Agricultural Economics and the Bureau of the Census, contains data on the characteristics of the population in farm-operator households, by economic class of farm (based on 1950 Censuses of Population and Agriculture), as well as a discussion of the definitions of farm population and farm-operator household population. The various Census of Population publications of the Bureau of the Census contain detailed data on the characteristics and geographic distribution of the rural-farm population. In addition, certain of the Current Population Reports, particularly those in Series P-20, P-50, and P-60, published by the Bureau of the Census, contain current estimates relative to the characteristics of the rural-farm population of the country.
