



On behalf of the **Harvest of Hope Foundation (HOH)**, it is my pleasure to present to you the HOH 2011 Annual Report.

This year HOH distributed **over \$71,000** in critical financial assistance to migrant farmworkers and families across the country. Other notable accomplishments include:

- a) **\$25,000** was provided this year in scholarship aid to children of migrant farmworkers attending college.
- b) **More than 2,500** pairs of gently used donated shoes and sneakers were distributed by HOH to migrant farmworkers and families across the country.
- c) Since its establishment in 1997 HOH has distributed **more than \$916,000** for medical services, car repairs due to breakdowns while traveling, bus tickets, rent, utilities, funeral expenses, food, clothing and educational scholarships.
