

Technical Note

The Annual Worker Plan was introduced by the Bureau of Employment Security and its affiliated State employment security agencies in 1954. This Plan was based on prior experience in scheduling migratory workers on the Eastern Seaboard. Its purposes are to help provide a dependable labor supply to farm employers and to maximize the employment opportunities of migrant farm workers by arranging successive job referrals.

As part of the Plan, interviews are conducted with migrant groups in their home areas and in their places of employment. Information collected on the origin, size, composition, previous employment pattern, future job commitments, and other characteristics of each crew is entered on a Migratory Labor Employment Record (Form ES-369). Copies of this form are distributed to the crew leader's State of residence, as well as to other States in the crew's itinerary. In this way, States where migrants are employed develop records on this component of their seasonal farm work force, while the home States of the migrants accumulate a complete record of the number, characteristics, and movement of their own residents participating in the migratory stream.

The attached tables are based on ES-369 data gathered in the course of 1959 AWP operations. In using the tables, it is important to note that (1) only interstate migrants contacted under the Plan are included, and (2) the migrants assisted by the Plan are only part of the total migratory work force.

Table 1

Column 2 of Table 1 shows the number of interviews conducted with migrants in each State and recorded on Form ES-369. The total is broken down in columns 3-5 to show separately the number of interviews with crew leaders, with heads of families traveling without crew status, and with others (mainly single workers traveling alone or in small groups). Numerous other contacts with migrants which did not result in completed ES-369 forms are not included in these figures.

Columns 6-9 indicate the family status of migrants shown on ES-369 forms as having been employed in each reporting State during the year. This information is particularly useful for planning and evaluating housing and related health and welfare services for the workers. It should be noted, however, that not all of the families and single workers shown were necessarily employed in the State at the same time of the year.

Table 2

Table 2 shows the results of the interviews conducted and recorded on ES-369 forms under the AWP. Column 3, "Referral to jobs," indicates the number of interviews in which migrant groups were scheduled to jobs in response to definite orders from labor demand States. Column 4, "Job request forwarded," shows the number of contacts resulting in transmittal of a Form ES-369 to labor demand States for the purpose of seeking employment for a migrant group. Column 5, "Schedules confirmed," shows the number of contacts made with migrant groups to confirm the data on their latest Form ES-369 or to check their arrival at previously scheduled jobs. In column 6, "Information only," is shown the number of interviews made to record information on crews which did not seek or require employment service assistance. These contacts resulted in useful information about the migrants and improved employment service relationships with workers and employers. Column 7 covers the performance of other services.

Table 3

Table 3 shows the number and selected characteristics of migrant workers assisted by the AWP. This table provides an unduplicated head count of migrants. Columns 2-9 show for each State the number of its own residents contacted under the plan anywhere in the country. As the home State receives copies of all ES-369 forms prepared for its residents by other States, it is in a position to report this information.

In column 10, the number of migrants who actually engaged in farm work is indicated by their States of residence. This number is smaller than the migrant total in column 6 because (1) it excludes nonworkers, and (2) it excludes workers who were not interviewed by their States of residence but were contacted in other States along their route. These workers furnish an area of potential expansion of AWP services by their home States.

Tables 4, 5 and 6

In these tables, each State agency reports the home State, the State of previous employment, and the State of next employment of migrant groups interviewed. If the Form ES-369 did not reveal the last or next States of employment, the home State was used for these items.
