Welcome to the resource portion of this manual. The purpose of this section is to provide the health care professional with a list of materials and organizations relevant to farmworkers.

The resource chapter is divided into two parts. The first is a listing of Materials that will assist outreach workers providing services to the farmworker population. It is organized into five subjects: AIDS, Pesticides, Diabetes, Tuberculosis, and Other. Under each subject the materials are organized alphabetically by title. The name, length, language, a summary, and additional information are provided about each material. Also included is a means of obtaining the materials. All of the organizations that produce these materials are listed in the second section of this chapter.

The second part of this chapter includes a brief description of Organizations that distribute or produce information relevant to the health status of farmworkers. It is organized alphabetically for easy use. It is important to note that many different organizations are subsidiaries or offshoots of others. For example, the National AIDS Clearinghouse is part of the Centers for Disease Control which is a branch of the National Institutes of Health which is part of the US Department of Health and Human Services. To combat this confusion, wherever necessary we have listed agencies under several possible names.

Here is an example of how to use the resource section. Let us say that you were doing a presentation on Diabetes and wanted to find a handout to distribute to the farmworkers. First, you would turn to the Diabetes heading in the materials section. Next you would scan all of the titles until you found one which seemed promising. After scanning for information on price, accessibility, language level, language of printing (English/Spanish/Creole), the length, and more, you would decide if the materials were appropriate. You would then turn to the second section, the list of Organizations, and find the name, address, and phone number of its producer. Finally, you would contact them for copies. It's that simple.

We hope that you will find this chapter a valuable tool in your efforts. For successful use here are some final reminders.

- First, this is by no means a complete list of what is out there, so don't end your search here.

- Second, most organizations are generous about sending a sample or two. However, with a little persistence and a lot of creativity, additional samples are easily obtained free of charge.
- If you are unable to get a material from its producer, there are probably other organizations that carry the same material. This can often be a good cost saving mechanism.
- Additionally, many companies and agencies produce catalogs with complete listings of the materials they produce or distribute. Some of these catalogs have been written up in the Materials section and/or are mentioned in the Organizations section. They should not be overlooked for researching purposes, as they are a valuable resource.
- An important note is that there are many clearinghouses and database agencies capable of conducting searches (often free of charge). Be sure to use them.
- Never overlook the possibility of making your own materials. Often times the best materials are the simplest ones. Materials with basic pictures and few words often get the message across best. This is easily done with a little help from the Xerox and some elementary art work.
- Finally, if you discover a great resource you feel all ECMHP, Inc. outreach staff should have a copy of--contact the ECMHP, Inc. headquarters. They are able to purchase materials in bulk which greatly reduces the cost per item.

We understand that there are an endless number of resources out there and that the number grows every day. If you encounter an organization or material which you find valuable and it is not in this listing, please let the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. know. Chances are, if it worked for you it will work for others. With all of this in mind you should be well prepared for your information search. Good luck and happy researching!

AIDS

About Universal Precautions in Health Care settings Scriptograph Cartoon Book English

This is just one of a large series of scriptograph comic books tackling the issue of AIDS. The series confronts AIDS from a large number of perspectives. This particular booklet addresses AIDS from the stand point of a health care provider. It discusses all of the precautions that need to be taken in order to minimize the risk of HIV infection. It is written in very simple english and provides a complete but brief overview of the topic. The information in the booklet is given by bubble faced cartoon characters of no apparent ethnicity. The office in Washington has copies obtained from the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services in Miami. These cartoon booklets are originally produced by Channing L Bete, Inc. and are then sold to these various organizations. For a complete look at all the different comic books produced see the Channing L Bete catalog at the East Coast office in D.C. or call Channing L. Bete.

AIDS Think About It Brochure English/Spanish

Half of the brochure is written in English and half is written in Spanish. How AIDS is transmitted/not transmitted, how to be safe, how AIDS effects pregnancy, and where to get help are all listed in the pamphlet. The language is elementary and clear, making this a good handout for farmworkers. The National Migrant Resource Program has copies of this brochure as does the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. Larger quantities should be ordered from Network Publications at P.O. Box 1830 Santa Cruz, CA 9501-1830, 408-438-4080. The cost is \$14.00 for 50, \$100 for 500 and \$170 for 1000 (title# 163).

AIDS: A Growing Crisis Among Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Families Booklet 40 pages English

This booklet offers a thorough discussion of the current AIDS crisis within the farmworker community. The writing high school level. It would be an excellent piece of reading for an individual unfamiliar with the current farmworker situation. It is packed full of dramatic black and white photos of farmworkers. These might translate to good visual aids with permission. The ECMHP, Inc.

office in D.C. has a copy and additional copies may be obtained through the National Commission to Prevent Infant Immortality.

AIDS?

Brochure

English

An excellent handout, this illustrated brochure gives very basic information and drawings about AIDS. It covers how AIDS is transmitted/not transmitted, how to use a condom, and how to get more information on AIDS. The language is elementary school level. The People of Color Against AIDS Network produces it and distributes it for \$.25 a copy (free samples available!) The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

AIDS News

Comic Book

English/Spanish

The People of Color Against AIDS Network produces this comic book story about AIDS. The book contains all the basic information about AIDS, how it is transmitted/not transmitted, how it effects the body, and presents it through a story of several high school age kids. The characters in the story are of different races and the language is very simple, making this a good handout or teaching tool for the farmworkers. ECMHP, Inc. in D.C. has a copy. Additional copies may be purchased from POCAAN for \$.35 a copy (free samples).

Claudio Y Diego

Video 30 minutes

Spanish

Details how a farmworker learns he has HIV. His wife is pregnant so the video discusses the risks for her and the child, how they can avoid getting the virus etc. Produced and distributed by the Blue Ridge Health Center for about \$50. ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

Consejeria y Analisis Voluntarios Para HIV: Hechos, Temas y Respuestas

25 page booklet

Spanish

This is another of the Center for Disease Control's AIDS information booklets. This one uses black and white photos of people from different races and backgrounds to convey information about the virus and disease. It is written in simple Spanish and has some simple illustrations. Visually it appears a bit wordy, but it would still make a decent handout. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

Cuando Un Amigo Tiene SIDA

Pamphlet

Spanish

This publication is distributed by the State of Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services. In English the title translates "When a Friend Has AIDS." It is written in fairly advanced Spanish and does not give much information about the disease. Rather, it gives advice on how to act around someone who has AIDS and how to talk to them about it.

El Condon: Proteccion Contra las Enfermedades de Transmission Sexual

Color Brochure 13 pages

Spanish

Friendly appearance, moderate language complexity, and valuable information make this brochure a good handout for farmworkers. It offers information about how and why to use condoms, specifically focussing on preventing transmission of the AIDS virus. The Center for Disease Control puts out this publication. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

El Enfermo De SIDA No Es Peligroso

Cartoon Book 7 pages

Spanish

This cartoon is a series of animated pages giving information about the AIDS virus. The information is given by characters of Latino origin making this a good source of information for the farmworker population. The Spanish is relatively basic as is the information relayed. The Johns Hopkins University Center for Communications Program has copies of this cartoon as does the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C.

El SIDA Esta Matando A Los Trabajadores Agricolas Y Sus Familias

Brochure

Spanish

CATA produces this wonderful pamphlet on AIDS. It is targeted directly for at farmworkers, with drawings of farmworkers, simple Spanish, and many helpful illustrations. This brochure is strongly recommended as a handout to the farmworkers because of its friendly nature. It contains all basic AIDS information such as how AIDS is transmitted and how to prevent infection.

El Uso de los Condones para Prevenir el SIDA y Otras Enfermedades de Transmission Sexual

Brochure

Spanish

This brochure gives eight highlighted tips on when and how to use condoms to prevent the transmission of sexual disease. It stresses the importance of

condoms and their effective use. It is written in simple Spanish and has no real illustrations but is visually friendly. The Center for Disease Control produces it and should be contacted for copies. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

EI VIH en los Adultos

Booklet 17 pages

Spanish

All basic facts about the HIV virus and AIDS are given in this booklet. There is also information about Tuberculosis and Syphilis and how they relate to HIV. It is written in moderate to simple level Spanish with few pictures, making it slightly visually intimidating. It may make a good handout to farmworkers with a higher literacy level. Copies may be obtained from the Agency for Health Care Policy and Research Publications Clearinghouse. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

EI VIH y su Niño

Booklet 17 pages

Spanish

This booklet gives general information about the AIDS virus but specifically focuses on AIDS/children and related issues. The Spanish is relatively simple but there are few pictures making this a slightly intimidating booklet. The Center for Disease Control publishes it and should be contacted for additional copies. The ECMHP, Inc. office also has one.

Fact Sheet: HIV/AIDS

Leaflet

English

This fact sheet, similar to the one on Tuberculosis, has farmworker relevant statistics and demographic information about AIDS. It is not appropriate in its raw form for the farmworker, but may contain relevant information about them. The information on the sheet might be a good addition to a presentation or lesson plan. On the back of the sheet is a list of references and resources which could be valuable. The ECMHP, Inc. has a copy of this. The National Migrant Resource Program, Inc. produces this sheet and should be contacted for additional copies.

Farmworkers and HIV Colloquia

3 Ring Binder

English

This 4" thick three ring binder has a collection of information on AIDS and farmworkers. Most of the information is very technical and might be good reading for the health practitioner or outreach worker. However, the information

is too sophisticated and technical for someone without good reading skills and a health background. The book has nine sections: farmworker status, oral manifestations, tuberculosis, primary care case studies, infection control, women and HIV, pediatric HIV, and resources. The resource section is fairly comprehensive. The information was compiled by the National Migrant Resource Program and the Migrant Clinician Network with funding from the Centers for Disease Control. ECMHP, Inc. in D.C. has this notebook.

General Information

Slides

English/Spanish/Creole

The Center for Communications Program at Johns Hopkins University has a series of informational slides about the AIDS virus. African American cartoon characters illustrate, with simple text, many basic facts about the AIDS virus. Slides are available with information such as how AIDS is transmitted, how it is not transmitted, how to care for people with AIDS, how to live positively with AIDS/HIV, and how to avoid getting the disease. They would make a good part of any presentation on AIDS. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy of all of these slides.

Herr Video Library

Video Listing 100 titles

English

This is a complete listing of all titles in the State of Florida's Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services' video library. The East Coast office in D.C. obtained a copy through the Health Education and Risk Reduction Program of Miami. The state has over 100 different videos. Most of them concern AIDS but they represent a variety of perspectives. There are biographical documentaries, television news programs, informational videos, and many more. The library contains both English and Spanish videos. The list is very complete and deserves a look through by any health educator looking for good AIDS materials.

I Don't Need To Wear One of Those / OK, But Next Time Wear One

Brochure

English/Spanish

These are two separate brochures. The former is written for males and the latter for females. They simply answer why people need to wear condoms and how to use them. The language is easily understood and the text is very clear. The message is very simple, use condoms. Besides being gender specific the brochures are targeted towards minorities. Although, the information is universal enough to be relevant to all. This would make an excellent handout. ECMHP, Inc. in D.C. has a copy of each in Spanish and English. Additional

copies may be obtained from the People of Color Against AIDS Network for \$.25 a copy. However, a sample may be obtained free of cost.

The Karate Kids Book(s)
Cartoon Book / Work Book 60 pages
English

This consists of two parts. The first is a small abbreviated miniature cartoon book which teachers hand out to their students. The second is a teaching version which contains all the dialogue for the cartoon and a host of activities to do after reading it. The thought is that the teacher may read the story as the students follow along in their miniature pictorial versions, and afterwards the class can do several follow up activities to reinforce the lessons learned. The cartoon story is told through a cast of characters. In it, a number of street dwelling children are tempted into the world of AIDS by the "smiling man", a wealthy gangster type who offers them money for sex. The plot is unclear and slightly odd with portions of the language being quite profane. Many of the activities also involve very frank discussions and profane language. It is difficult to determine whether the book would be well suited or inappropriate. It is definitely worth looking at for that reason. The book is produced by Street Kids International but may also be found at the Johns Hopkins Center for Communication Programs. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy for sneak preview.

La Prevencion Del VIH Y Del SIDA
Booklet 16 pages
Spanish

With few pictures and many words this booklet gives complete information about the prevention of AIDS. It is written in a moderate level of Spanish. There are quotes inside the booklet that make it slightly more interesting than the average brochure. The Center for Disease Control produces it and should be contacted for additional copies. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

Let's Talk About AIDS
Workbook 7 pages
English

Channing L. Bete produces this activity book about the AIDS virus. The book incorporates the entertainment and involvement of games with basic facts about AIDS. It is written to address a younger, perhaps junior high and below, population. However, it may be fun for people of all ages. This book may be a good source of ideas for activities and presentations on the AIDS virus. Channing L. Bete charges for large quantities of the book, but gives out free samples. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

Resources/Materials/Organizations

Mi Hermano
Video 30 minutes
Spanish

This video contains the death of a young man from AIDS complications. The man dies early in the video and most of the scenes involve family members dealing with his death and learning more about HIV/AIDS. Sold and distributed by the Red Cross for about \$12. ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

My Brother
Illustrated Documentary Booklet
English/Spanish

This publication is produced by the American Red Cross and SIDA Latino Program. It is an illustrated story of a family confronted with AIDS. The story is told in a photo novela format with photographs as illustrations. It contains some information on how the disease is transmitted and ways that it may not be transmitted. This may be an excellent resource to pass out to the farmworkers. An alternative use of this booklet may be to organize the workers into the various characters and have them act out the play. The family in the story is Latino as are all the characters. The book would be very relevant to the farmworker and a great educational tool. The Washington, D.C. office has a copy which it obtained from the Health Education Risk Reduction Program in Miami.

Ojos Que No Ven
Video 1 hour
Spanish

A video in a tele-drama format, Ojos contains scenes of IV drug users and prostitution to demonstrate the risks and realities of AIDS. The video is available from the National Council of La Raza. It costs about \$100.

Se Met Ko/Pitimi San Gado
Videos Both 30 minutes
Haitian Creole

These are two extremely well produced videos about AIDS in the Haitian community. Se Met Ko is more geared for adults and details how a man's attitude changes as he learns more about more about AIDS and using protection. Pitimi San Gado is a humorous and dramatic portrayal of AIDS and discrimination. Also contains important information about testing, transmission, etc. Actors are all teenagers. Contact the Haitian Women's Program or the Haitian Coalition on AIDS in NY.

**Sex and STDs: How to Stay Safe
Cartoon Booklet
English**

This booklet contains seven pages of very basic information on STDs. It lists some of the different diseases, how they may be transmitted, how to prevent transmission, and phone numbers of various hotlines. It lists separate phone numbers for English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole AIDS hotlines. The information in the booklet covers a wide variety of topics but may be too incomplete to be of much help. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy of the booklet. Additional copies may be obtained through the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services.

**SIDA Se Lenmi Nou
Comic Book
Haitian Creole**

This glossy color comic book gives a cartoon illustrated documentary on the basic facts about AIDS. It details how it may be spread, its symptoms, etc. It is a very simple and relatively complete education material. It would be ideal for the Haitian farmworker. It is produced by the Greater Miami Chapter of the Red Cross in conjunction with the Florida Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy which it obtained through the Health Education Risk Reduction Program in Miami, FL.

**SIDA y El Embarazo
Brochure
Spanish**

Advanced language and no pictures give this brochure a very intimidating appearance. It possesses good information about AIDS and pregnancy but may not be very appropriate for the farmworker. Its one advantage is that it is printed in Spanish. The Maternity Center Association produces this brochure.

**Time Out: The Truth About HIV/AIDS
Video 40 minutes
English**

Stars Magic Johnson and Arsenio Hall and features many famous entertainers. Good information, with comic and dramatic scenes. Geared towards MTV generation but can be effective for African American or English speaking Latinos, especially young people. Many libraries and video stores will rent it for free.

Tres Hombres
Photo Novela 12 pages

Spanish

This photo novela introduces the topic of AIDS and gives AIDS related information through the story of three Latino gentlemen. It is very culturally relevant and has good information about the different means of HIV transmission. The dialogue is simple as is the level of Spanish. It would make a great handout for the farmworkers. The People of Color Against AIDS Network in combination with Novela Health Foundation produce this publication.

Un Amigo De Confianza
Photo Novela 16 pages

Spanish

This is a story about two gay men and their discussion of AIDS. It is in a photo novela format which is a series a black and white photos similar to a cartoon, with dialogue balloons. The language and dialogue is simple and the information is good. While a story about gay men may not be universally well received in the farmworker community, it is bound to be informative to some of the population. The People of Color Against AIDS Network produces it.

Understanding HIV infection and AIDS

Brochure and Booklet

English

This booklet and its duplicate brochure are produced by Krames Communications. It is a colorful, well illustrated, quick source of information about the AIDS virus. The language is relatively sophisticated. It is written at high school level with many good pictures that, with the proper permission, would make excellent educational displays. Samples of the booklet may be obtained from Krames Communications for free. However, larger numbers of the brochure cost \$0.40 and the booklet goes for \$1.00 each. The East Coast Migrant Health Project in Washington, D.C. has a copy.

What Everyone Should Know About AIDS

Scriptograph Cartoon Book

Spanish / English

This is another of Channing L. Bete's scriptograph booklets written for general audiences. This cartoon illustrated booklet gives a lot of general information about AIDS. It discusses how AIDS affects the body, high risk behavior, how AIDS may not be transmitted, and precautions to reduce the chance of transmission. The information is written on a junior high school level and is given by non-ethnic balloon shaped cartoon characters. This would make a good handout and teaching tool for the farmworker. However, Channing L. Bete charges approximately one dollar per copy (less for bulk orders). Often

times many health education centers or non-profit organizations have many copies which they will distribute for free. The Planned Parenthood of Hidalgo County is a good example. Also the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has copies of many of these cartoon booklets and other related ones. East Coast also has a catalog of all available scriptographs.

You and AIDS

Brochure

English

This brochure offers the basic facts about AIDS; how it is transmitted/not transmitted, symptoms, and how to avoid transmission. It also explains how to use a condom. It is full of simple pictures and few words making it a great handout for farmworkers with lower literacy levels. Contact the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services for additional copies.

Zanmi Ayisyen-m yo An nou lite Ansanm Kont SIDA

Booklet

Haitian Creole

This booklet is produced by the League Against AIDS, Inc. It contains all of the basic information about AIDS and displays it with great simple pictures and few words. Contact the League Against AIDS for details.

Tuberculosis

About Tuberculosis (TB) Scriptograph Cartoon Book English / Spanish

This is another of the Channing L. Bete scriptographs. This one contains a wide array of information about tuberculosis. It gives basic information about how the disease functions, how it is transmitted, how it can be treated, its symptoms, how it is tested for, etc. It is written at a simple level and could be used as a handout to the farmworker or as a health center resource. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy along with a catalog of all Channing L. Bete's scriptographs. This booklet may also be obtained through the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services, the Health Education and Reduction Program of Miami, or Channing L. Bete the original producers. It is possible to obtain one or two samples free of charge. However, there may be a charge for any larger number.

Backgrounder - Tuberculosis Booklet 8 pages English

The Backgrounder is a publication of the National Institutes of Health. This April 1993 edition covers all of the basic up to date information about Tuberculosis. It briefly explains what the disease is, its resurgence, transmission, about the organism that causes TB, infection, diagnosing, and more. This publication is similar to a series of fact sheets. The information is communicated in a text format, no pictures. This, along with the advanced level of writing makes it quite complex. However, the information would be very informative to anyone doing health education and might be translated into some excellent presentation materials. The National Institutes of Health's National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases produces this publication and it may be obtained through their Office of Communications in Bethesda, MD. The June 1993 issue details the research agenda for the investigating the disease. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has both of these along with additional articles about TB.

Fact Sheet: Tuberculosis Leaflet English

Statistics and demographic information about TB are mainly what this leaflet provides. The level of presentation would probably not be appropriate for farmworkers but might be informative to the health care professional. It could be useful in devising a lesson plan or presentation. A lot of the statistics given are specific to the farmworker population. On the back of the fact sheet is a

long list of references which may provide useful information about the disease. The National Migrant Resource Program produces this sheet at no cost and the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy.

Health - Tuberculosis

Leaflet

Spanish/English

This one page leaflet gives very basic, brief, and somewhat incomplete information about tuberculosis. However, it does list some valuable information such as symptoms, how it may be spread, and the need to see a doctor. The language used is relatively simple. This fact sheet is produced by BOCES Geneseo Migrant Center and funded by the United States Department of Education. The ECMHP, Inc. office has a copy.

HIV Related TB: How to Help Yourself

Booklet

English

This booklet is similar to the brochure that follows. It gives basic information about what HIV/AIDS are, what Tuberculosis is, and the connection between the two. It explains how TB is transmitted, how to be tested for it, and why to be persistent when fighting it. The information is useful but not totally complete. There are simple multicultural pictures to go along with very simple basic English. The National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases produces this booklet. The Center for Communication Programs at Johns Hopkins University and the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. have copies also.

Prevention and Control of Tuberculosis in Migrant Farm Workers: Recommendations of the Advisory Council for the Elimination of Tuberculosis

Booklet 15 pages

English

This report gives very specific information about tuberculosis in the farmworker population. It discusses in detail infection and transmission, recommendations about prevention and control, diagnosis, hospitalization and isolation, treatment, monitoring response, monitoring compliance, contact investigation, screening, preventive therapy, and follow up. The information in this guide would be valuable to any outreach worker or practitioner, however, the writing is college level and would probably not make a suitable handout for farmworkers. This booklet is the June 5, 1992 (Vol. 41, No. RR-10) edition of the Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report and may be obtained from the USDHHS Public Health Service's Center for Disease Control. The East Coast Migrant Health Project has a copy.

Tuberculosis

Videos

English, Creole, Spanish

The American Lung Association has produced a number of different educational videos about Tuberculosis from different angles. Some of the videos are more appropriate for clinical settings while some could be used in group presentations. Contact your local ALA or the national office for details.

Tuberculosis Get the Facts

Brochure

English/Spanish

This brochure gives a quick no frills presentation of Tuberculosis. It explains what the disease is, its symptoms, who is at high risk, and how to get tested for it. Also, a quick explanation of the difference between carrying the germ and having the active disease is offered. The brochure is very bland with mostly text and few illustrations. It may be too impersonal and uninteresting for the farmworker. It may also be too advanced. However, the information is complete, making it a good source of information for the outreach worker. The ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy. Larger quantities may be obtained from the Centers for Disease Control's Center for Prevention Services, Division of Tuberculosis Control.

Tuberculosis The Connection between TB and HIV (the AIDS virus)

Brochure

English / Spanish

What TB is, how it is transmitted, its symptoms, and how it relates to HIV and AIDS are all topics introduced in this pamphlet. The language is at a junior high school level and the booklet is universally directed. The Center for Disease Control Center for Prevention Services produces this and the ECMHP, Inc. office in D.C. has a copy. It is a fairly common brochure distributed to many health organizations.

Pesticides

A Consumer Guide To Safer Pesticide Use

Booklet 24 pages

English

The information in this book is written at a high school level and contains parts which are fairly technical. This guide covers EPA guidelines, tips for preparing, storing, and disposing of pesticides. In addition, emergency information, recent developments, and information about how to choose a pest control company are given. It is clear that this book is aimed more towards the average consumer than the farmworker. However, there is some information and pictures that may be useful to a health practitioner. Citizen's Guide To Pesticides

Booklet 21 pages

This booklet, as indicated by the title, is written for the average consumer and not specifically for the farmworker. However, the book has information that might be useful to an outreach worker. Topics such as prevention, tips on handling, storage, how people are exposed to pesticides, emergency procedures, and removal are all covered in the book. These include pesticide exposure, signs and symptoms of poisoning, emergency first aid, other health effects, personal protective equipment, respirators, heat stress, pesticide labels, transporting pesticides, storing pesticides, mixing and loading pesticides, cleaning up pesticide spills, cleaning pesticide containers, disposing of pesticides and pesticide containers, flagging, applying pesticides, and cleaning up. Each unit contains a section of learning objectives, opening questions, and closing questions for review. There is an overview of general information at the end of the book. This short booklet gives a brief overview of basic nutrition principles. It provides a short discussion of each of the four food groups and how they should be used to maintain good nutrition. There is also a small section on illnesses related to poor nutrition such as low iron anemia, obesity, and
